


The National Framework for Qualifications

- 10 level framework.
- ■Generic ranges of standards of knowledge, skill and confidence at each level.
- Levels in the framework contain a wide range of awards.
- Leaving Certificate is at level 4 and 5 on the NFQ

What is CAO?

- CAO stands for Central Applications Office
- What does CAO do?
- •They <u>process</u> applications for undergraduate courses in Irish Higher Education Institutions (HEIs).
- •They do not **SET** the points for courses.
- CAO has thousands of courses listed in the CAO Handbook

Stages of CAO Application

Stage 1:	Before you apply: Do your research, register for virtual open days, study, set goals.
Stage 2:	Completing your application: Online is recommended www.cao.ie
Stage 3:	Record of Application: CAO will send you a statement of application record (end of May)
Stage 4:	Change of Mind: Up until the 1st of July
Stage 5:	Leaving Certificate Results (mid- August)
Stage 6:	Offers and acceptances of places: (end of August, early September)







Restricted Applications

Some courses consider more then just points.

Eg: Interviews, Tests, Auditions, Portfolios or Projects.

These are conducted around **Easter**.

These courses <u>can't</u> be added to your application after <u>February 1st.</u>

They can be **changed** or **dropped**.

Your Application Number

- apply online application number will appear on your Receipt of Online Application.
 - This number is private and it will be used in every correspondence between you and the CAO for the rest of the year.
 - If you apply online you may change your course choices free of charge until January 31st.
 - *Goal* Apply now and have at least one course entry made before the Holidays

Reply from CAO -Statement of Application Record

The Statement is important for two reasons:

- The Statement of Application record includes notification of your CAO application number.
- 2. It also includes a **list of the courses** that you have applied for.

If you have made any mistake or omission in your course choices then now is the time to rectify your error. The statement of application record arrives late May.

Pay particular attention to restricted courses.

Check Your Statement of Application Record.

Check the following carefully, if there is any error or omission, amend the Statement and return it to CAO.


Are all the courses shown and in the correct order?

Are all the codes correct?

Are the exam numbers correct?

Are all exams mentioned?

If you do not receive a Statement by 1st June contact CAO immediately.



In the week following the release of the Leaving Certificate results **CAO will email** a communication to all applicants.

The Offer Process

If you have not yet become entitled to an offer you will be sent a Statement of Application Record which you should check carefully as important information may be incorrect or missing.

The Offer Process

If you are entitled to an offer, you will be sent an offer notice. You should check that all of the details on the offer notice are correct and that there are no omissions.

Offers will also be available on the CAO website.

You may check for and accept offers on the website. In fact, most applicants now record acceptances online. Your offer notice may contain an offer

for a Level 8 course

or a Level 7/6 course

or both

The Offer Process

If you receive two offers at the same time you may only accept ONE of them.

If you wish to accept an offer of a place you must carry out the instructions on the offer notice before 5.15pm on the closing date for acceptance printed on the offer notice.


There can be no delays at the offer/acceptance stage.

The Offer Process

Any offer not accepted by the closing date for receipt of acceptance of offers in CAO will be offered to another applicant in the next round of offers.

How Places are Allocated

We will look just at Level 8 courses, but exactly the same process will take place with Level 7/6 courses, and at the same time. The importance of you, the applicant, placing courses in genuine order of preference will become apparent in the following slides.



Student Universal Support Ireland -SUSI

 An on-line application process covering all grants available to new students entering college for the first time

Click on the SUSI icon on the student grant page and register your personal details...

When you're happy with your application hit the submit button on the last page...

(Once your application has been submitted you will only be able to change your contact details by using the 'Change Your Personal Details' section on the main menu. Note: you will not be able to make changes to any other section of your application. After you submit your application, the system will send you an email with a copy of your application for information purposes only.)

SUSI will look at your application



SUSI will then send you a personalised document pack...



The pack will include:

- A schedule of the documents (photocopies only required) that are required from you to process your application further;
- A personalised declaration form that needs to be signed by all parties to your application;
- Explanation notes on the specific documents requested and guidance on where to get any documents required;
 - A pre-addressed envelope to facilitate the return of your documents to SUSI.

Step 3 continued...

All SUSI postal correspondence will be addressed to the applicant and will display the SUSI logo on the envelope.

In the event of any difficulty or query in relation to the documents requested, contact the SUSI Support Desk for assistance.

Returning your Documents

You must return:

Your application Declaration Form signed by all parties to your application;

Your personalised document list together with photocopies of all your required documents at the same time in the pre-addressed envelope provided.



4th Step

SUSI will then assess your application with the documents provided by you and advise you if you are provisionally awarded for a student grant for the 2020-2021 academic year. You will be notified of the final step of the application process which you need to complete when you have selected your final college/course.

Payment of Student Grants

When you're registration for an approved course at an approved college has been confirmed SUSI will arrange to pay your student grant on a monthly basis directly into your Irish bank account.

DARE Disability Access Route to Education

- Students with disability or any health problem are eligible to apply for the DARE scheme.
- ■DARE is for school leavers with a disability under the age of 23 as of 1 January 2022, who have been educationally impacted as a result of that disability.
- Offers college places on reduced points to school leavers with disabilities.

DARE

- Step 1 Tick the box on the CAO form.
- Step 2 Complete the supplementary information form (SIF).

Decisions regarding eligibility will be made by Higher Education Institutions in June 2022.

DARE Application

- Part A must be completed online by the applicant outlining the impact of his disability on his education.
- Part B must be completed by a member of the academic staff, providing an academic reference and information on his education experience.
- Part C provides verification of condition from medical consultant or psychologist.

What are the application and closing dates for DARE?



- By 17:15 1st February 2022 apply to CAO on www.cao.ie
- By 17:15 1st March 2022 You must indicate that you have a disability/specific learning difficulty on your CAO application form .
- By 17:15 1st March 2022 You must indicate your wish to be considered for DARE by ticking 'Yes' to Question 1 and complete Section A (Questions 1-5) of the Supplementary Information Form (SIF) on www.cgo.ie.
- By 17:15 15th March 2022- You must return the completed, signed AND stamped
 - 1. Educational Impact Statement (Section B)
 - 2. Evidence of Disability (Section C) or other evidence of Disability to the CAO, Tower House, Eglinton Street, Galway by 17:15. Faxed/emailed documents are not accepted.
- April/May: Assessment of DARE applications
- Late June 2022: You will be notified of application outcome
- ▶If you are unable to complete the online form you must submit the paper application form (distributed by the CAO) by the same date.

HEAR Higher Educatio n Access Route

- Offers places on reduced points and extra college support to school leavers from socio-economically disadvantaged backgrounds.
- Step 1 Tick the box on the CAO form.
- Step 2 Complete the HEAR form and submit all relevant supporting information.

Eligibility Criteria for Traditional apprenticeships

- Apprenticeship eligibility depends on the type of apprenticeship a student is interested in. <u>Most traditional apprenticeships require:</u>
- Apprentices must be at least 16 years of age and have a minimum of grade D in any five subjects in the Junior Certificate or equivalent. However, employers may require additional minimum qualifications.
- Or
- They satisfactorily complete an approved preparatory training course and assessment interview. For information on these courses please contact your local Employment Services Office;
- **O**r
- hey are over 18 years of age with a minimum of three years relevant work experience and satisfactorily complete an assessment interview.
- Employment Apprentices must be employed in their chosen occupation by an employer who has been approved by SOLAS. The employer must register the apprentice with Solas.

Eligibility Criteria for New apprenticeships

- You need a Leaving Cert with
- Grade 06 at ordinary level in 5 subjects, two of which must be Maths and a language (English or Irish) or equivalent (QQI Level 5/6).
- Some apprenticeships may have additional specific requirements.
