#### Career Guidance in TY



#### Objective

- The central role of our Careers programme in TY is to raise student awareness of their strengths, interests, skills and abilities.
- Coupled with promoting a greater awareness of their sense of self, we provide information on future career opportunities, course/college requirements, the labour market, apprenticeships and the world of work, etc.
- This ultimately leads to a clearer ability to decide on what subjects they are interested in studying for Leaving Certificate.

#### How do we do this



- Through Weekly Career Classes: This year TY students had 20 hours of Career Guidance (2 classes a week for 10 weeks).
- Visiting speakers from different career sectors: example the defence forces.
- Presentations from Higher Education Institutes this year this was done virtually, but in previous years we would have visited the campus of UL, Maynooth, Carlow IT, etc.

#### How do we do this



- Self-Assessment tools such as PROBE, Careers
   Portal skills, values, career interest tests.
- Each student completed a career investigation to explore future career/college/course interests.
- World of Work preparation interview skills classes and through the creation of CV's and Cover letter.





# Transition Year Fee

The total fee for TY this is year is €525.

€150 is due March 19<sup>th</sup> with acceptance form with €175 on the 16<sup>th</sup> of April and €200 due May 28<sup>th</sup>.

All bus trips are €5 per trip, as in other years.

Included: Microsoft Office Specialist (€100) which completion is compulsory for graduation.

Not included: Carlingford €200 approx. is due on return to school in September.

Not included: Gaisce (overnight trip/bus/meals) €75 approx.


#### Next steps







Students must complete the online Application form and submit by March 5<sup>th</sup> at 1.15pm.



Marks are awarded at interview for the 4 listed criteria plus marks from the Principal/Year Head.







Each interviewer will independently mark each candidate after their interview.

The cumulative mark from all the interviewers will be the mark for that student.

A ranking list will be completed after the interviews with student's name, mark and rank, based on their mark.

# Interview Competencies & Marking Scheme



Marks from Principal/Year Head for positive attitude in previous years towards school/work/behaviour. (20 Marks)



Application Form (20 Marks)



What has this student contributed to school life? (20 Marks)



Being a Team player / evidence of participation and volunteering in activities. (20 Marks)



Knowledge of TY Programme (20 Marks)

#### Admissions



The maximum number of available places will be dependent upon staffing, facilities and resources and will be determined annually by the Board of Management.



For acceptance on to the Transition Year Programme, the school must believe a student can benefit from participation in Transition Year and, equally, that his/her participation will not prevent any other student(s) from benefiting from participation.



Any decision in this regard will be taken by the Transition Year Admissions Committee & Interview Panel.
