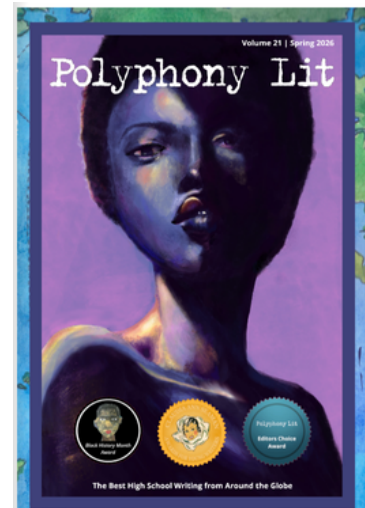

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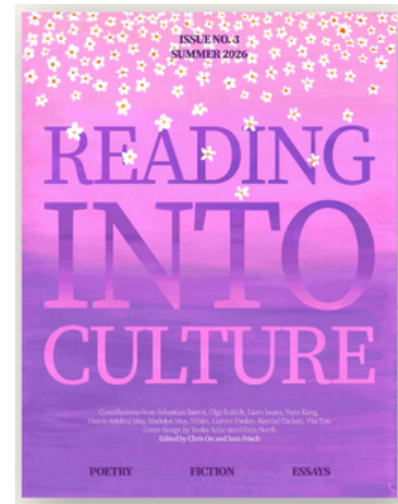

About: A student-focused publication that welcomes thoughtful and creative work exploring literature, culture, identity, and society.



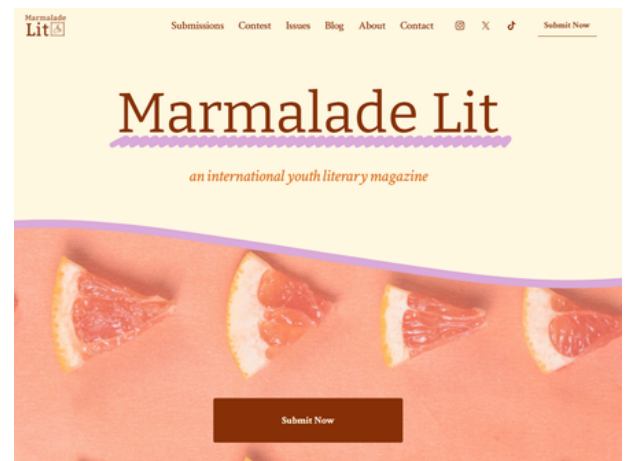

About: An accessible youth literary publication that showcases emerging writers and artists.



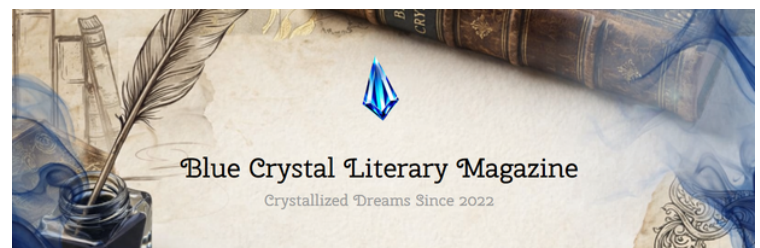

About: A student-centred magazine that highlights creative writing from young people worldwide.



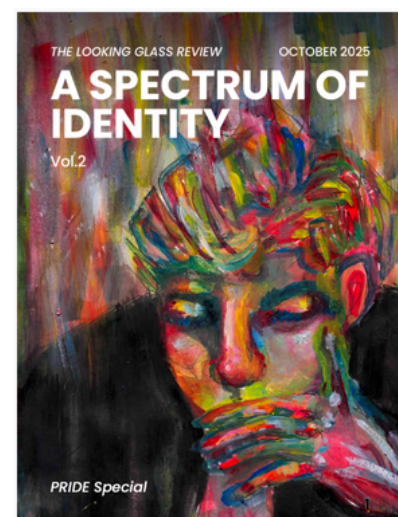

About: A publication dedicated to promoting new voices and providing young writers with publication opportunities.





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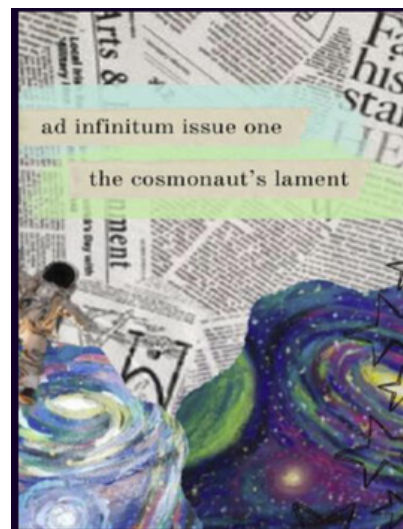

About: One of the largest platforms for teen writers, allowing students to publish work across a wide variety of genres and topics.



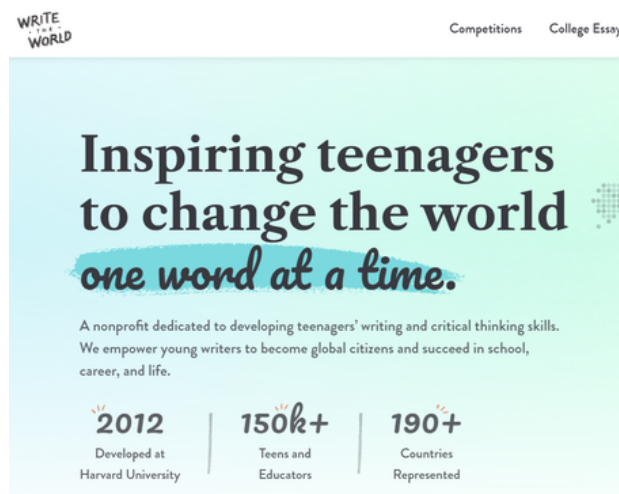

About: Combines publication opportunities, peer feedback, writing prompts, and regular international writing competitions.



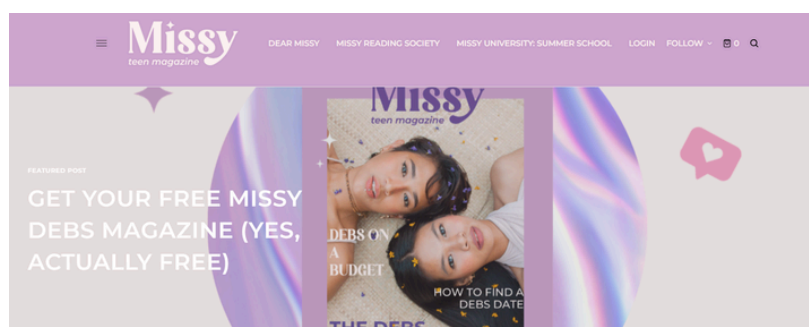
Missy Teen Magazine
