#### Senior Prefects



#### **Transition Year News**

The Transition Year (TY) students at Scoil Chonglais have had a busy and exciting start to the year, participating in a wide variety of educational, creative, and outdoor activities designed to develop skills, resilience, and leadership.

- TY students took part in the EiSHT Emotional and Mental Self-Defence workshop over two days. Using Lego Serious Play and other interactive resources, students explored self-awareness, personal development, and strategies to build resilience.
- A representative from the No Name Club visited Scoil Chonglais to introduce students to their organisation and encourage new memberships, inspiring students to engage in community service.
- Work Experience TY students began their work experience placements in a wide variety of local businesses, gaining practical skills and insight into different career paths.
- Camping Trip to Graiguenamanagh Thirty-six TY students enjoyed two action-packed days camping in Graiguenamanagh. Activities included canoeing and hydrocycles on the River Barrow, as well as a scenic hike. The trip provided an opportunity for teamwork, outdoor adventure, and fun.
- National Ploughing Match Championship Twenty-nine TY students attended the National Ploughing Championships in Screggan, Tullamore. With over 2,000 stalls, live demonstrations, and career information, the students had the chance to explore agriculture, rural enterprise, and new technologies.
- Future Leaders GAA Programme Students began the Future Leaders GAA programme, gaining hands-on experience in coaching, refereeing, event management, and promoting health and wellbeing. Five students refereed their first matches at a local GAA pitch, demonstrating their leadership skills.
- TY students participated in a number of Enterprise Talks in preparation for our Annual Christmas
   Fair
- The Climate Fresk
- Sara from Waggle Learning delivered a Climate Fresk Workshop to TY students on Tuesday 14th October. After the first half of the workshop looking at climate change, the groups focused on how to lower their carbon footprint and finished off with an activity building a more sustainable Baltinglass (out of Lego). This really opened up the student's creativity. The last group will complete this workshop on Thursday 23<sup>rd</sup> October.
- First Aid Training Our TY students completed First Aid training which was very beneficial to them all. They even learned how to use our onsite defibrillator.
- Home Economic classes have been very busy at Tearmann Community Garden.
- TY Geography students had the opportunity to busy The Lord's Wood to complete a Field Study!
  These activities reflect the broad and dynamic Transition Year experience at Scoil Chonglais,
  helping students develop skills, independence, and confidence while having fun and engaging
