Minister for Health Jennifer Carroll MacNeill TD visited our school on Monday for an empowering leadership conversation with the TY students.

During her talk, she told us that she went to Loreto College St. Stephens Green, where she played lots of basketball, and discussed how her break into politics came from being a legal advisor to Enda Kenny. She described thinking about running for local elections and asking her family for their thoughts, to which she was met with no support. It was one friend that pushed her and told her "What do you have to lose?". The support of one friend was enough to push her to put herself out there, and she won the vote. She encouraged us to just "turn up" no matter how hard it gets.

Minister Carroll MacNeill told us that if there's anything we want to do, to go after it and not be afraid of seeming too "confident". Most notably she pushed us all to pursue a career in politics and said she "hopes to see one of us as Taoiseach one day".


