While some groups attended presentations in the Lecture Theatre, others visited the exhibitor stands in the Sports Hall, creating a steady flow of activity across both spaces. The staggered format also ensured that every student had ample time to explore the exhibition, ask questions, and gather information tailored to their interests.

In the Lecture Theatre, Aer Lingus delivered an inspiring presentation, highlighting the growing need for more female pilots within the aviation industry. They encouraged students to remain resilient when pursuing aviation careers, noting that many successful pilots are not accepted on their first attempt. Bray Institute of Further Education also provided a valuable overview of the diverse routes available through further education, including tertiary degree and BTEC courses.

Meanwhile, students visiting the Sports Hall had the opportunity to speak with 18 exhibitors representing a wide range of colleges, universities, apprenticeship providers, and public services.
