Lourdes Pilgrimage

Last week, 6th Year students Anna Barry, Maya O'Reilly, Rosa Corrigan, Annabel Greenwood and Lauren Callaghan travelled with their teacher Ms Hayes to Lourdes as part of the annual Dublin Diocesan Pilgrimage.

Throughout the week, the girls undertook duties at the Acceuil Notre Dame, which is 'a place of welcome' close to the Grotto with many of the facilities of a modern hospital, More than 100 sick pilgrims stay here during the pilgrimage and the girls assisted at the hospital reception, as well as on the wards.

Over several days, the students took part in a number of different liturgies, such as the torchlight procession and the Stations of the Cross. They took time to light a candle for our school community and submitted petitions on behalf of the staff and students of Loreto Abbey Dalkey.

The girls spent time with pilgrims in the town, visiting the Grotto and the Basilica, and found that they formed deep connections with their fellow pilgrims from schools and communities within the diocese. The whole experience was undoubtedly memorable, and left everyone feeling uplifted, and immensely fulfilled.

School Traffic Reminder

Given the large numbers of students and staff who are approaching the school morning and evening, we ask parents to drop/collect their daughter on Harbour Road only, and **NOT on Loreto Avenue** (the road approaching the school and Sports Hall). This causes a backlog of cars, as well as posing a safety risk for students.

The school grounds are a designated parking area for staff of both the primary and secondary schools. Consequently, it is not possible to drop students in the grounds during school hours.

Foundit and Lost Property

We use the FoundIt system in school to reunite students with their lost items. It is most important that your daughter has **everything** labelled with her FoundIt stickers, as this will ensure a prompt return of her missing property.

When an item is found in the school, it is scanned and an automatic email is generated and sent to the student informing her that her item has been found and can be collected from the Lost Property office.

International Literacy Day

Monday September 8th was International Literacy Day, a UNESCO day to highlight the importance of literacy in all forms.

Despite progress, at least 739 million youth and adults worldwide still lacked basic literacy skills in 2024. At the same time, 4 in 10 children are not reaching minimum proficiency in reading.

"UNESCO is celebrating this year's International Literacy Day under the theme of 'Promoting literacy in the digital era', inviting us to rethink what it means to be literate today. Indeed, reading and writing alone are no longer sufficient. Countries must also integrate media and information literacy into their school curricula – and UNESCO is supporting them in doing so." - Audrey Azoulay, Director-General of UNESCO

Digitalisation has been changing ways in which we learn, live, work and socialise, in both positive and negative ways. While digital tools can help expand learning opportunities for marginalised groups, this digital shift also risks creating double marginalisation – exclusion not only from traditional literacy learning but also from the benefits of the digital age.

Beyond reading and writing on paper, literacy in the digital era enables people to access, understand, evaluate, create, communicate and engage with digital content safely and appropriately. Literacy is also central for fostering critical thinking, discerning credible information and navigating complex information environments.
