

# TY Sleep Out for Focus Ireland

Last Friday, more than 110 Transition Year students took part in the Focus Ireland Shine a Light Sleep Out to raise essential funds for Focus Ireland's services. The students headed home after school to get all their belongings, returning for a night under the stars from 7pm to 7am.

We are so extraordinarily proud of the effort the TYs put in to both fundraising and awareness over the last few weeks. Their efforts certainly paid off as they absolutely smashed their fundraising goal of €20,000, and instead **raised a staggering €34,274** with some donations still coming in. This makes Loreto Abbey Dalkey the top school fundraiser in the country and top 5 when put alongside some of the country's largest corporations.

All of this fundraising effort will go towards Focus Ireland's critical services - including the provision of one-on-one support for children with dedicated social workers, hot and nutritious meals in the Focus Ireland Coffee Shop, and access to education and training services - all of which are coming under increasing demand as the number of homeless families increases.

Thank you once again to our wonderful TYs, to the brave teachers who stayed with them for a night of no sleep, and to the whole school community for donating so generously to such a worthy cause.

After the success of last year's book drive, which saw more than 500 books donated, we are calling on students, staff and parents to get involved once more!

The growth of the library is an important part of the literacy and wellbeing initiatives within our school. With a range of ages, interests and reading levels, we are hopeful that our Book Drive will stock the shelves with a greater choice for all students to enjoy.

#### What kind of books?

We have three fiction sections - Junior, Intermediate and Senior - where books are categorised by suitable reading age and interest level.

In Junior Fiction, books include popular series such as *The Hunger Games*, *A Good Girl's Guide to Murder*, *Divergent*, *The Inheritance Games*, *Murder Most Unladylike*, and *The Maze Runner*, as well as hundreds of standalone books such as those by RJ Palacio, Sarah Crossan, Sophie McKenzie, Cathy Cassidy and so many more.

In Intermediate Fiction, books include series such as Twilight, Children of Blood and Bone, The Gilded Ones, Noughts and Crosses, and The Knife of Never Letting Go, as well as standalone books such as those by Matt Haig, Becky Albertalli, Holly Bourne, Malorie Blackman, Agatha Christie, John Green, and many more.

In Senior Fiction, books include many of the Booker Prize and Women's Prize for Fiction winners, as well as authors including Sebastian Barry, Isabel Allende, Tracy Chevalier, Margaret Atwood, Fredrik Backman, Kristin Hannah, Kazuo Ishiguro, Taylor Jenkins Reid, Claire Keegan, Maggie O'Farrell, and hundreds more.






#### Leinster Golf Success
