I congratulate the class of 2025 on their excellent Leaving Certificate results. We are a school with a mixed ability intake and encourage all our students to do their best. 175 H1 grades were awarded across all subjects with six students reaching maximum points. As I have said on many occasions, statistics, no matter how impressive, do not adequately reflect the personal achievements behind the numbers. We are aware of the diligence, sacrifices, the resilience and the quiet determination that characterised this class and we wish them every success as they continue the next stage of their academic journey.



# Foundit and Lost Property

We use the FoundIt system in school to reunite students with their lost items. It is most important that your daughter has everything labelled with her FoundIt stickers, as this will ensure a prompt return of her missing property.

When an item is found in the school, it is scanned and an automatic email is generated and sent to the student informing her that her item has been found and can be collected from the Lost Property office.

# Mobile Phone Policy Updates

At each of the back to school orientation sessions, students were advised of the amendments to our school's Mobile Phone Policy. Important excerpts of this policy are shown here, and we would ask all students and parents to familiarise themselves with the relevant changes.

The Mobile Phone Policy can also be viewed in full on the school website.

Where a student brings a mobile phone to school, the mobile phone/smart phone must be switched off and stored in the student's locker whose responsibility it is to ensure that it is securely locked. Students are not permitted to use their mobile phones at any time on the school premises, on school trips or sporting events with the exception of students with medical conditions that require access to a mobile phone or app as a diagnostic instrument. In the event that students are travelling to or from school trips or sporting fixtures on coaches, they must adhere to the Code of Behaviour.

b. Students found in contravention of (a) will have to submit their phone every morning to the relevant Deputy Principal to be stored in a magnetised pouch for the full school day for a period of five days from the day of the incident. In the case of a subsequent offence, this penalty would extend for a longer period of time.

# School Uniform Reminders

Our school uniform promotes a sense of belonging to the school community and is a visual symbol of Loreto Abbey, our values, ethos and high standards.

We would ask all students and parents to ensure the Code of Behaviour rules regarding our uniform are followed at all times, as well as rules around piercings, false nails and eyelashes.

The following uniform items are to be worn on a daily basis:

- Green jumper (fleece over in cold weather,
- no hoodies)
- Striped shirt
- Green skirt (knee length only, no tracksuit worn underneath)
- Grey knee length socks
- Black/navy leather shoes only (no runners, trainers, logos or details)

#### P.E. Uniform Only:

- School tracksuit bottoms/school leggings/school shorts
- School sports shirt
- School fleece

Please make sure to label **ALL** uniform items and belongings.

7.9 Bullying (Please refer to our Bí Cineálta: Anti-Bullying Behaviour policy)

Conduct which is injurious to the mental and physical well being of others is not conducive to good school morale or to a secure learning environment.

Students should not engage in any activity that could be interpreted by others as harassment, intimidation or bullying.

Bullying is defined in Cineáltas: Action Plan on Bullying and Bí Cineálta: Procedures to Prevent and Address Bullying Behaviour for Primary and Post-Primary Schools as:

- Targeted behaviour, online or offline that causes harm.
- . The harm caused can be physical, social and/or emotional in nature.
- Bullying behaviour is repeated over time and involves an imbalance of power in relationships between two people or groups of people in society.

Loreto Abbey Secondary School, Dalkey is committed to developing and implementing a Bí Cineálta policy that sets out how the school community prevents and addresses bullying behaviour. Strategies to deal with inappropriate behaviour that is not bullying behaviour are provided for within the school's Code of Behaviour.

You will note a list of types of bullying behaviour with detailed strategies to prevent each one in our Bí Cineálta policy (June 2025) available in the policy section of the website.

Single offline incidents of intentional negative behaviour involving an imbalance of power are not considered bullying but must still be addressed under the school's code of behaviour. Posting a single harmful message/image/video online, and which is highly likely to be reposted or shared with others can therefore be seen as bullying behaviour.

However, in the context of the Anti-Bullying Behaviour policy, placing a once-off offensive or hurtful public message, image or statement on a social network site or other public forum where that message, image or statement can be viewed and/or repeated by other people will be regarded as bullying behaviour.

## Bí Cineálta!

If you think that you are being bullied or someone else is being bullied, you need to tell a teacher or another adult that you trust. They will know what to do to help.
